






RELIGION



gladiators.




ROMAN FOOD

- For **drinks** had wine an water.
- The Romans did not sit on chairs around the table like we do today.
- The Romans ate with their fingers and they used spoons, only, for soup.
- The poor Romans ate simple meal(vegetables and porridge); The rich Romans ate elaborate dinner







